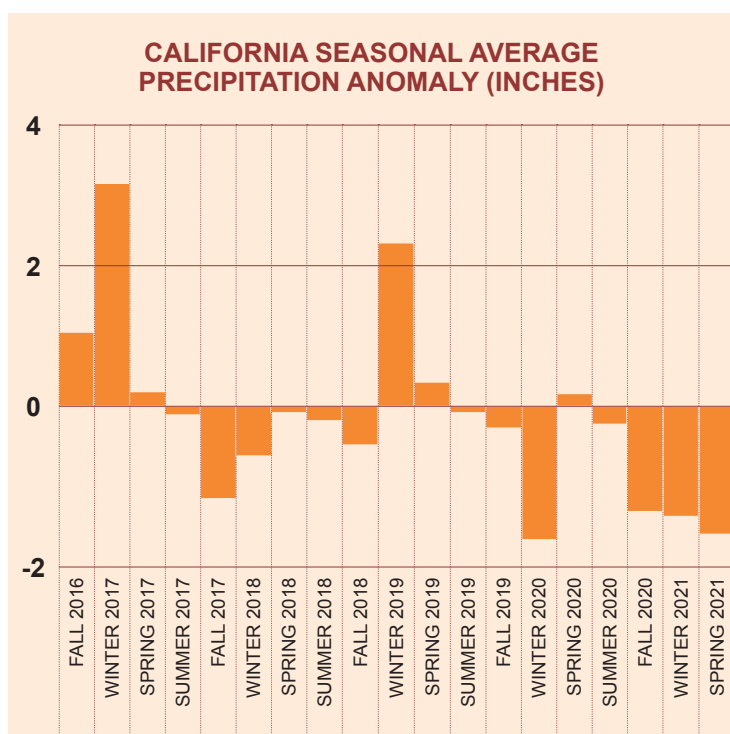
ANTICIPATE A WILDFIRE SEASON SIMILAR TO 2018

Lower than average Winter/Spring precipitation (2018)

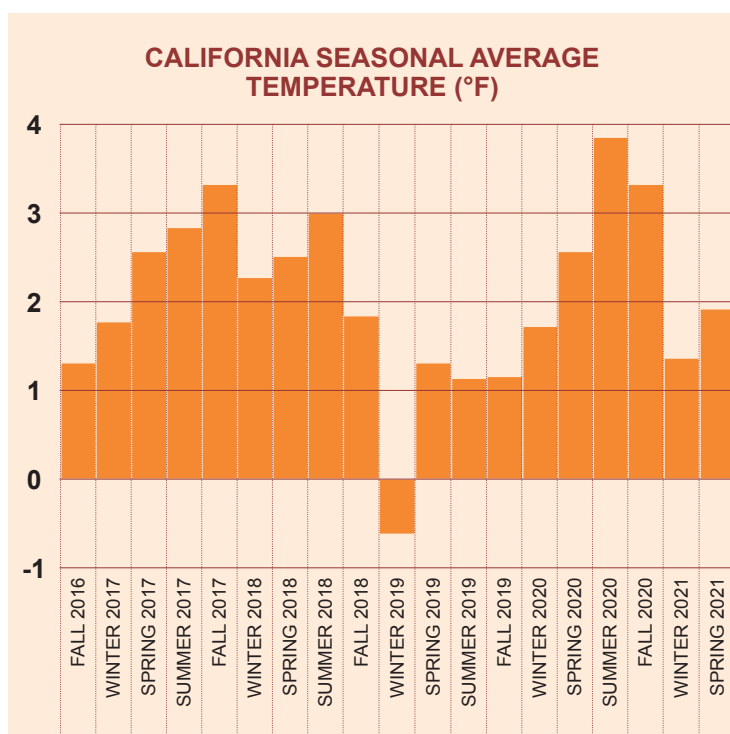
Higher than average Winter/Spring temperatures

Expect a warmer and drier Summer than average

Exacerbates current Western State drought conditions

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HIGHER RISK AREAS INCLUDE

- **California:** Central Valley, East Bay, San Joaquin Valley, Coast Ranges, Sierra, and SoCal (toward the end of the season)
- **Oregon:** Central
- **Washington:** Southeast

High chance dry season extends into Fall and overlaps with **Santa Ana & Diablo** wind seasons.
