

## **US Wildfires Outlook (April – June 2022)**

## **SPRING 2022 OUTLOOK**

MAJORITY OF THE WEST, PLAINS, AND TEXAS ARE IN A DROUGHT WITH ABNORMALLY DRY CONDITIONS ACROSS FLORIDA AND IN PORTIONS OF THE CAROLINAS.

- Due to La Niña condition in the winter, the lack of precipitation has prolonged the long-term drought that has been troubling the West.
- As a result of the drought, there is an abundant amount of dry vegetation to fuel fires and high winds will further spread wildfires.
- In the spring there will be severe weather (critically dry and windy periods) for most of the Plains, specifically the southern and central High Plains.


## HIGHER RISK AREAS FOR SIGNIFICANT FIRES

In April, expect above normal condition in:


- Florida
- Georgia
- The Carolinas
- The Plains (central & southern)
- Florida (continuing into May)


## In May and June, expect above normal condition in:

- Most of Southwest: southern and western Colorado and southern portions of the Great Basin
- Northwest: Central Oregon
- Northern California: Bay Area, mid Coast-Mendocino, and Sacramento Valley and Foothills (in June)
